



ORDINANCE NO. 21

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF VILLAGE MARSHAL PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF THE SAME, PRESCRIBING THE MINIMUM BONDS FOR THE FAITHFUL DISCHARGE OF HIS OFFICIAL DUTIES, DEFINING HIS DUTIES AND PROVIDING HIS COMPENSATION FOR THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF REXBURG, IDAHO:

SECTION I: That there be, and is hereby created the office of Village Marshal, in and for the Village of Rexburg.

SECTION II: That the Village Board shall, at a regular meeting held between the first Tuesdays of April, and the first Tuesday of May of each and every year, appoint a Village Marshal who shall hold his office for one year, and, until his successor is appointed and qualified, unless sooner removed for cause. The Village Board shall appoint a Village Marshal at any regular meeting to fill a vacancy caused by death, resignation or removal.

SECTION III: The Village Marshal shall, before entering upon the discharge of his official duties, subscribe to the official oath, and give bonds with two good and sufficient sureties in a sum not less than \$500.00 for the faithful discharge of his official duties, said bonds to be subject to the approval of the Village Board.

SECTION IV: The Village Marshal shall attend all regular meetings of the Village Board; he shall see that the City Hall is lighted and warmed, whenever necessary, for all regular and special Board Meetings; it shall be his duty to ring the bell in the belfry of the District School of School District No. 15 at eight o'clock in the evening of each day during the months of October, November, December, January, February and March and at nine o'clock in the evening of each day during the months of April, May, June, July, August and September; he shall have charge of the Village Jail and it shall be his duty to look after and have charge of all persons incarcerated therein. It shall be his duty to take such measures as shall be necessary to secure the peace and good order at all public meetings; he shall patrol the streets of Rexburg from eight o'clock P.M. to eleven o'clock P.M. each and every evening of the week when not engaged in other official duties, as herein before or hereinafter defined.

SECTION V: That it shall be his duty to preserve the peace and good order of the Village of Rexburg; to quell all riots arrest and bring all disorderly persons before the Justice of the Peace for trial or examination either with or without process; he shall make any and all arrests for the violation of any of the Village Ordinances and take the offending party before the Justice of the Peace for trial; he shall serve all processes issued by the Justice of the Peace, to him directed, for violations of the Village Ordinances.

SECTION VI: The Village Marshal may, at any time, call upon any citizen to assist him in making arrests, whenever it is necessary to do so, but he shall not have the right to appoint deputies only by, and with the consent of the Village Board.

SECTION VII: The Village Marshal shall receive as compensation for services rendered as defined in Section IV of this Ordinance the sum of one hundred dollars per annum, twenty-five dollars of which shall be paid to him at the end of each three months, viz; On the first Mondays of July, October, January and April.

SECTION VIII: The shall receive as compensation for services rendered as defined in Section V of this Ordinance such fees as are allowed the precinct constable for similar services under the general laws of the state.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after the first Monday of April A. D. 1900.
