**ORDINANCE NO. 49**

**AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE LEAVING OF TEAMS UNHITCHED IN THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE VILLAGE OF REXBURG, AND ALLOWING THEM TO REMAIN HITCHED LONGER THAN CERTAIN PERIODS, AND PRESCRIBING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE SAME.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF REXBURG, IDAHO;

**SECTION I** – It shall be unlawful for any person to allow or permit any horse, mule or other such animal used for domestic purposes, to stand or remain in the streets, alleys or other public place within the limits of Rexburg, Idaho, unhitched, unless the owner thereof, or some other person is holding or guarding the same, or for any person to permit or allow any horse, mule or other such animal to stand or remain hitched on any of the streets, alleys or public places of Rexburg, for a longer period at any one time than four hours, without food or water and proper protection in inclement weather.

**SECTION II** – The city marshal is hereby empowered to impound any horse, mule or other such animal found unhitched or any such animal which is found allowed to stand hitched in violation of Section 1, and he shall feed such animal at the expense of the owner, and such expense shall be a lien on the animal until paid.

**SECTION III** – Any person guilty of violating any of the provisions of Sections 1 and 2, of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof be punished by fine in any sum not exceeding twenty five dollars or imprisonment in the city jail not exceeding twenty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
