



ORDINANCE NO. 198

ORDINANCE OF INTENTION TO CREATE AND ESTABLISH LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 7, FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF CEMENT SIDEWALKS AND GUTTERS UPON PROPORTION OF MAIN STREET, FIRST EAST STREET, FIRST WEST STREET, FIRST SOUTH STREETS, SECOND SOUTH STREET, THIRD EAST STREET AND SECOND NORTH STREET, IN SAID DISTRICT, THE COST OF WHICH IS TO BE LEVIED AND ASSESSED UPON THE PROPERTY BENEFITED BY SUCH IMPROVEMENTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REXBURG, IN MADISON COUNTY, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO:

SECTION I – That it is the intention of the mayor and city council of the City of Rexburg, Madison County, Idaho, to create and establish said city a local improvement district to be known and called “Local Improvement District No. 7”

SECTION II – That the names of the streets to be improved, the points between which such streets are to be improved, and the general character of such improvements are as follows:

Main Street – a gutter on the north side of Main Street, between First West Street and Second West Street and between Center Street and First West Street, west from the middle of the block.

First East Street – a six foot cement sidewalk on the west side of First East Street between Main Street and First South Street, a six foot cement sidewalk on the west side of First East Street, between First South St. and Second South St.

First West Street – a six foot cement sidewalk on the east side of First West Street between Main Street and First South Street.

First South Street – a five foot cement sidewalk on the north side of First South Street, between Center St. and First East Street, a four foot cement sidewalk on the north side of First South Street, between Center Street and First West Street, five rods towards First West Street.

Second South Street – a five foot cement sidewalk on the south side of Second South Street, between Center Street and First East Street.

Third East Street – a four foot cement sidewalk on the east side of Third East Street, between Second East Street and Third East Street.

Second North Street – a four foot sidewalk on the South side of Second North Street, between Third East Street and Fourth East Street, 183 feet towards South East Street.

SECTION III – That the improvements to be made in said proposed Local Improvement No. 7 are as follows, to-wit:

Cement sidewalks and cement gutter to be graded or filled and constructed according to plans specifications and ordinances of the City of Rexburg, approved by the City Council, and on file in the office of the City Clerk.

SECTION IV – That the estimate cost of cement sidewalks per square foot is twelve (.12) cents, that the estimate cost of gutter per lineal foot is thirty cents (.30) and that the estimated cost of said improvement is \$2400.00.

SECTION V – That the cost and expenses of said improvements are to be assessed against the property abutting, fronting, contiguous or tributary (and included in said district) on the said street to be improved and shall be assessed in proportion to the number of feet of such property fronting on street to be improved in said improvement district, and in proportion to the benefits derived by such property from said improvements.

SECTION VI – That all persons who may desire to protest against the making of the improvements mentioned in this ordinance and the creation of said local improvement district no.7, may file their protest against said proposed improvements in the office of the City Clerk at any time on or before the 21st day of June 1916, at the hour of 8 o'clock p.m. at which time and place the Mayor and City Council of said city will meet to consider any such protests theretofore filed and determine whether or not to proceed with said proposed improvements.

SECTION VII – That the City Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to give due and legal notice hereof, by causing this ordinance to be published in the Rexburg Standard, a weekly newspaper published and of general circulation in said city, for two consecutive weeks, proceeding the 21st day of June, 1916.
