



ORDINANCE NO. 278

AN ORDINANCE FURTHER REGULATING THE USE OF WATER IN THE CITY OF REXBURG, COUNTY OF MADISON, STATE OF IDAHO, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Rexburg, County of Madison, State of Idaho:

SECTION I: All tapping of water mains must be done by the Superintendent of Waterworks or under his direct supervision.

SECTION II: The charge for tapping mains shall be as follows:

The actual expense, to be determined by the Superintendent of Waterworks.

SECTION III: The rent for water meters furnished by the City shall be the following rates per annum in addition to base and water rates, to-wit:

One-half inch meter	\$1.50
Three-quarter inch meter	1.50
One inch meter	2.80
One and one-half inch meter	4.00
Two inch meter	5.00
Three inch meter	12.00
Four inch meter	24.00

Meter rent shall be paid semi-annually on the first day of December and the first day of June of each year.

SECTION IV: All new applicants for water and all present water users through meters shall, from and after May 1st, 1922, deposit with the City Treasurer the following sums to-wit:

For one inch meters or under	\$10.00
For meters over one inch	20.00

Said deposit to be made as a guarantee for full payment to the City for the use of water, for rental of meters, or for injury to meters, and will be returned to water user when service is disconnected and all water rentals and rentals for meters is paid.

SECTION V: The City may refuse to furnish in any manner whatsoever, water to any consumer who refuses to receive water through meters when the Superintendent of Waterworks or City Council order the same put in or who refuse to make the deposit required by Section IV of this Ordinance.

SECTION VI: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION VII: Whereas an emergency exists this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and due publication as required by law.
