



ORDINANCE NO. 329

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING SOLICITORS, PEDDLERS, HAWKERS, ITINERAND MERCHANTS AND TRANSIENT VENDORS OF MERCHANDISE FROM GOING IN AND UPON PRIVATE RESIDENCES IN THE CITY OF REXBURG, MADISON COUNTY, STATE OF IDAHO, NOT HAVING BEEN REQUESTED OR INVITED SO TO DO BY THE OWNER OR OWNERS, OCCUPANT OR OCCUPANTS OF SAID PRIVATE RESIDENCES, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SOLICITING ORDERS FOR THE SALE OF GOODS, WARES AND MERCHANDISE, AND/OR FOR THE PURPOSE OF DISPOSING OF AND/OR PEDDLING OR HAWKING THE SAME: DELARING THE SAME TO BE A NUISANCE AND DESCRIBING THE PUNISHMENT THEREFORE; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF REXBURG:

SECTION I: The practice of going in and upon private residences in the City of Rexburg, Madison County, State of Idaho, by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants and transient vendors of merchandise, not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said private residence, for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise, and/or for the purpose of disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same, is hereby declared to be a nuisance, and punishable as such nuisance as a misdemeanor.

SECTION II: Any person convicted or perpetrating a nuisance as described and prohibited in the first section of this Ordinance, upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), together with costs of proceeding.

SECTION III: All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage approval and due publication, as provided by law.
