



To Whom It May Concern,

The following regulations for snow removal are provided for your information to help Rexburg maintain a safe City for pedestrian traffic.

Responsibilities and Directions: Rexburg citizens and businesses **must remove snow and ice** from adjacent pedestrian areas. These areas include, but are not limited to, sidewalks, parking lots, and driveways. Each year, many avoidable accidents happen because of improper snow and ice removal. Compliance is crucial if we are to have a safe community. Citizens and business owners must comply with the following directions in snow and ice removal:

1. Citizens and business owners “**cannot**” push snow or ice across or into public streets (Idaho Code § 18-3907).
2. Snow and ice, once removed, **must be stored on the property**. For many property owners, snow and ice can be stored in the yard or other locations on the property. For owners of large properties, such as businesses with large parking lots, snow and ice storage areas must be incorporated into the property (Ordinance 1026 § 5.5[A] [9]).

Fines and Consequences: The following fines and consequences are applicable if a citizen or business owner fails to comply:

1. **After 24 hours** of notifying a citizen or business owner that they need to remove snow and ice from their property, the City of Rexburg has the right to remove the snow from the property at the expense of the property owner.
2. **Repeated refusal** to remove snow and ice may be punishable with a fine of up to \$300 and/or by imprisonment for up to six months (See Ordinance 1019 Art. I § A-C; Ordinance 1019 Art. III § A).
3. **Violations for obstructing public roads** with snow and ice is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$1000 and/or by up to six months in jail (Idaho Code § 18-113).
