ORDINANCE NO. 30

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CLOSING OF SALOONS, BREWERIES AND OTHER PLACES WHERE INTOXICATING LIQUORS ARE SOLD ON SUNDAYS AND PROHIBITING THE SELLING OR GIVING AWAY OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR ON SUNDAY, AND PROHIBITING THE USE OF BLINDS, SCREENS OR OTHER OBSTRUCTIONS ON THE WINDOWS OR GLASS OR GLASS DOORS, ON SUNDAYS, AND PROVIDING FOR A LIGHT TO BE KEPT BURNING BETWEEN THE HOURS OF TWELVE O'CLOCK SATURDAY NIGHT AND SIX O'CLOCK SUNDAY MORNING, ALSO BETWEEN THE HOURS OF SIX O'CLOCK AND TWELVE O'CLOCK SUNDAY NIGHT, AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF REXBURG, IDAHO;

SECTION I – It shall be unlawful for any person or persons whether for hire or not to keep open or cause to be kept open, within the corporate limits of the village of Rexburg, Idaho, on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, between the hours of 12 o'clock Saturday night and 12 o'clock Sunday night, any saloon, brewery or other place of business in which intoxicating, malt, wines, mixed or fermented liquors are kept for sale, to be drunk as a beverage.

SECTION II – It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to sell or give away or cause to be sold or given away within the corporate limits of the village of Rexburg, Idaho, on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, between the hours of twelve o'clock Saturday night and twelve o'clock Sunday night of each and every week, any intoxicating malt or vinous, mixed or fermented liquors, provided that drug stores may sell liquors for medical purposes on a prescription of a regularly licensed physician.

SECTION III – It shall be unlawful for any proprietor, renter or user of any saloon, brewery or other place of business, in which intoxicating malt or vinous, mixed or unfermented liquors are kept for sale, to be drunk as a beverage within the corporate limits of the village of Rexburg, to keep or cause to be kept any blinds, screens, curtains, frosting or any obstruction of any kind or nature whatsoever that will hinder or obstruct a complete observation of the interior of such building through the windows or glass doors of such building between the hours of twelve o'clock Saturday night and the hours of twelve o'clock Sunday night. The owner, renter or user aforesaid, shall cause also a light to be kept burning in the building so owned or used sufficient to light the interior of said building between the hours of twelve o'clock Saturday night and six o'clock Sunday morning, also between the hours of six o'clock and twelve o'clock Sunday night.

SECTION IV – Any person violating any part of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than 10 dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars together with all costs of conviction and judgment, and in default thereof shall be imprisoned in the village jail until said fine and costs are paid.

SECTION V – This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty days after its passage and first publication.
