



ORDINANCE NO. 32

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON, COMPANY, OR CORPORATION TO PEDDLE, OR HAWK ANY GARDEN OR FARM PRODUCT, FRUIT, BUTTER, EGGS, POULTRY, FISH, GAME, MEDICINE OR OTHER GOODS, WARES OR MERCHANDISE IN, UPON OR ALONG ANY OF THE STREETS OR ALLEY WAYS OF THE VILLAGE OF REXBURG, WITHOUT FIRST TAKING OUT A LICENSE THEREFORE, AND PRESCRIBING THE AMOUNT OF SAID LICENSE, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL GO INTO EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF REXBURG, IDAHO;

SECTION I – It shall be unlawful for any person, company or corporation to engage in or carry on any business of peddling, or hawking, or to offer for sale, barter or exchange at retail any garden or farm product, fruit, butter, eggs, poultry, fish, game, medicine or other wares or merchandise in, upon or along the streets or alleyways of the village of Rexburg, Idaho, without first obtaining a license therefore as hereinafter provided.

SECTION II – The license as hereinafter provided for shall be for a license to peddle fruit, \$2.50 per day; for a license to peddle vegetables, fruit and garden produce, butter, eggs, poultry, fish and game, \$2.50 per day; providing that nothing herein shall apply to fruit, vegetable, garden produce, butter, eggs and poultry raised within the limits of Fremont County, if offered for sale by the persons raising or producing of them.

SECTION III – Any person, company or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed fifty dollars and costs of conviction, and in default of payment of said fine and costs shall be imprisoned in the village jail and work upon the streets of said village on day for every two dollars of said fine and costs.

SECTION IV – This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty days after its passage and approval.
