



ORDINANCE NO. 63

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE APPORTIONMENT OF THE FUNDS OF THE CITY OF REXBURG, IDAHO, BEING THE ANNUAL APPORTIONMENT BILL FOR THE SAID CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING THE FIRST TUESDAY IN MAY, 1904.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REXBURG, STATE OF IDAHO.

SECTION I – That all moneys coming into the City Treasury from taxation, licenses, fines, forfeitures, penalties, and any and all sources whatsoever, shall be and th same are hereby distributed into six funds, designated as follows:

1. The Contingent Fund
2. The General Improvement Fund
3. The Road and Bridge Fund
4. The Ditch Fund
5. The Cemetery Fund
6. The Electric Light Fund

SECTION II – Said funds are created and established for the reception of said revenues and incomes for this period, having been estimated to amount to the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

SECTION III – The said city revenues and incomes derived from taxes, licenses, fines, forfeitures, penalties and rom any and all sources whatsoever, shall be, and are hereby apportioned and divided as follows, to-wit:

Into the Contingent Fund, the sum of sixteen hundred and fifty dollars (\$1,650) for the purpose of paying the salaries of the various officers and employees and for outstanding indebtedness;

Into the General Improvement Fund, the sum of one thousand dollars, (\$1,000) for the purpose of improving the public square and making improvements of any kind of a public nature which may be ordained by the mayor and council of said city, and for the purpose of purchasing real estate for the city;

Into the Road and Bridge Fund, the sum of one thousand dollars, (\$1,000) for payment for labor and improvements upon the streets, alleys, highways, etc., of said city

Into the Ditch Fund, the sum of five hundred dollars, (\$500) for the purpose of cleaning and keeping in repair the canals and laterals of the city, and for head-gates, culverts, weirs, etc.

Into the Cemetery Fund the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) for the purpose of cleaning out ditches, laying of walks, planting trees, repairing fence, and otherwise improving the Cemetery;

Into the Electric Light Fund, the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600) for the purpose of maintaining arc lights upon the streets of the city and for lighting other city buildings and offices.

SECTION IV – That all revenues received from other sources, the expenditure of which is not otherwise provided for by law or ordinance, shall be apportioned to the General Improvement Fund.

SECTION V – That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, an emergency exists, this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
