



ORDINANCE NO. 325

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 88 OF ORDINANCE NO. 283
RAISING THE LICENSE FEES CHARGED TRANSIENT TRADESMEN
AND REPEALING THE RATES CHARGED IN SAID SECTION 88 OF
SAID ORDAINANCE.**

BE IT ORDAINED By the Mayor and City Council of the City of Rexburg, Madison County, State of Idaho:

ARTICLE ONE – That Section 88 of the Ordinance No. 283 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Every transient tradesman before engaging in business, or before advertising or exposing his wares, goods or merchandise for sale, shall make affidavit, procure transient tradesman's license from the Council of the City upon application therefore, the same to be issued by the City Clerk, and he shall pay the City Clerk a license fee depending upon the time he proposes to engage in such business to be stated in his application, \$10,00 for the first day and \$8.00 for the second day, and \$3.00 for each additional day until the total shall equal \$50.00; which said \$50.00 shall be for three months.

The time for which said license is to run and the date of the expiration shall be specified therein. All such licenses shall expire on the first Monday in June following their issue. A license shall not give authority to more than one person to sell goods. Each license shall state that it is not assignable to transferable and that it may be revoked by the council at any time upon return to the licensee of the unearned license fee.

The words "transient tradesman", for the purpose of this Ordinance shall be construed to mean and include all persons, both principals and agents, who engage in temporary or transient business in this city, or in traveling from place to place therein selling goods, wares and merchandise, and who, for the purpose of carrying on such business, hire, lease or occupy any building or structure for the exhibition of sale of such goods, wares and merchandise.

ARTICLE TWO – All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance or any part thereof are hereby repealed.

ARTICLE THREE – This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and due publication in the manner provided by law.
