Resolution 07-11-1928

WHEREAS certain citizens and electors residing within the City of Rexburg, Idaho, have requested that the Mayor and Council of said city provide for and call a special election of the electors of and in said city for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such electors favor the keeping of theaters and moving picture shows open on Sunday, in said city; and

WHEREAS said applicants have agreed to pay and defray the costs and expenses of such a special election, and save the city harmless on said account; and

WHEREAS it has heretofore been ordered by the council that such an election be called;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Rexburg, Idaho:

Section 1. That a special election of the qualified electors of and in the City of Rexburg, Idaho, be and the same is hereby called to be had and held on the 3rd day of August A.D., 1928, whereat there shall be submitted to such electors for their determination, the question whether or not the City Council of said City shall pass an ordinance, to be approved by the Mayor, permitting theaters and moving picture shows to keep open on Sunday, in the City of Rexburg; and that at such election the following question be submitted to the electors voting thereat, namely:

“Shall the City Council of the City of Rexburg pass an ordinance permitting theaters and moving picture shows to keep open on Sunday in said City?”

Section 2. That there be appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the City Council, three judges of the election to act and serve as judges and clerk of said election, and that the Mayor with the consent of the Council appoint two special police to act as peace officers at the polling place during the said election, and that the compensation of such judges and officers be \$4.00 per day to be paid from funds deposited to pay the expenses of said election.

Section 3. That the City Clerk provide the necessary polling place for said election.

Section 4. That the polls for said election be open at the hour of 8 o'clock in the forenoon, and remain open until 8 o'clock in the afternoon of said day, and that said polls be closed at the time last mentioned.

Section 5. That only such persons as are qualified electors residing in said City and whose names appear on the registration list of the last city election in said city be authorized to vote at such election.

Section 6. That notice of said election be given by the City Clerk of said city by publication thereof for at least ten days before the date of said election in both Rexburg papers, a paper published weekly in said city, and that such notice state the time of holding such election and the place or places where same shall be held and the hours during which the polls shall be kept open and that such notice also contain the question set forth in section one hereof, and such other information as will advise the people or said city fully of the time of said election, the purpose thereof and the place or places whereat the people may vote.

Section 7. That a form of ballot be supplied under the direction of the City Clerk for the use of voters at said election and that the question set forth in section one hereof be printed in plain type on each of such ballots and that underneath said question the following be printed thereon, to-wit:

Theaters and Picture Shows on Sunday, Yes ---- ()

Theaters and Picture Shows on Sunday, No ----- ()

And that the voters express their answers by placing a cross in the space following the answer which they wish to give respectively.

Section 8. That the judges of said election shall canvass the votes cast thereat immediately after the polls are closed and certify the returns thereof to the City Council and that the City Council canvass said returns at the first meeting of the Council after said election.

Section 9. That there shall be deposited with the City Clerk by the said applications, the sum of \$200.00 estimated to be necessary to cover the costs and expenses of such special election and that all costs and expenses incurred by the city or any of its officers on its behalf on account of said election be paid by the City Clerk out of the funds so deposited and that if there be remaining any balance of such funds after all such expenses have been paid then such balance remaining shall be returned by the City Clerk to the persons who made said deposit or their order.
