Resolution 03-20-1929

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL of the City of Rexburg:

WHEREAS, by provision of the statutes of the State of Idaho, it is required that an election be held on the 4th Tuesday of April, 1929, in the city of Rexburg for the election of a Mayor, a City Clerk, a City Treasurer, and the councilmen; and

WHEREAS, the statutes also require that the City Council give public notice of the time and place of holding such election, together with notice of the place of registration of electors in each voting ward and the name of the registrar and the names of deputy registrars of the respective wards, and that it shall be necessary to register in order to vote at such election, and that such notice be given not less than twenty days previous to the election; and,

WHEREAS, by provision of the 1927 Session Laws of Idaho, it is made the duty of the registrant to enter the names of all persons appearing in the polling list of the next proceeding election, in the register for the election of 1929, and to make such register in triplicate; and,

WHEREAS, the City Clerk is by statute made the registrar for the City and provision is made for the appointment of deputy registrants, and it appearing that one (1) deputy registrar is necessary for each ward for the registration of electors for said election:

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED AND ORDERED that an election be, and the same is hereby, called to be had and held in the City of Rexburg on Tuesday, the 23rd day of April, 1929, for the election of a Mayor, a City Clerk, a City Treasurer, and two (2) councilmen for each of the three wards in said City.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that public notice of said election be given by publication thereof in The Rexburg Standard, the official newspaper of said City, for four (4) successive weeks beginning the 28th day of March, 1929, and that said notice set forth the time and place of holding said election and the polling places in the respective wards whereat said election will be held, together with the place of registration of electors in each of the wards and the name of the registrar and the names of the deputy registrars, and the places whereat electors may register in the respective wards; and setting forth also that all electors in said City who did not vote at the election held therein in April, 1927, shall be required to register in order to vote at said election.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the City Clerk of said City provide, at the expense of the City, registration books, blank elector's oaths, and all other election

supplies in forms similar to those used for County and State registrations and elections with such changes and substitutions as may be necessary for the purpose of said City Election.


IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the City Clerk make a register in triplicate of the electors in each of the three wards of said City, alphabetically arranged according to their respective surnames, so as to show in one column the name at full-length and in another column the Post Office Address of each elector, and that the City Clerk enter in said register in triplicate the names of all persons residing in each of the respective wards in said City whose names appear on the list of voters who voted at the election held in said City in April 1927; and that all electors who register for said election be entered by said Clerk in the same form in said register in triplicate.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that there be appointed one deputy registrar in each ward of said City to register electors for such election in the manner provided by law.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Chief of Police of said City, under the direction of the City Clerk and at the expense of the City, provide and arrange a suitable polling place in each of the wards of said City for said election
