Resolution 07-11-2014

Thereupon Councilman Frank D. Kelley presented the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF Rexburg, Idaho; that the requirements of sec. 49-1804 Idaho Code Annotated 1932, and any rules and regulations of this Council, requiring ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three different days, be, and the same are hereby, dispensed with so far as they relate to the foregoing proposed ordinance granting to Utah Power & Light Company, its successors and assigns, an electric light, and power franchise, and this Council shall immediately take action on the adoption of said ordinance.

The motion to adopt the resolution was seconded by Councilman Hugh A. Wright, and a “yea” and “nay” vote was taken, with the following results:

Those voting “yea” or in favor of the adoption of the resolution: James S. Webster, Frank D. Kelley, Fred Shirley, D.W. Stowell, and Hugh A. Wright.

Those voting “nay” or against the adoption of the resolution: none.

More than three-fourths of the Councilman elected to the Council having voted in favor of the adoption of the resolution, the Mayor declared it adopted, and ordered it spread at length on the minutes.

Councilman Frank D. Kelley thereupon moved that the proposed ordinance, granting a franchise to Utah Power & Light Company, as read by the Clerk, be adopted. The motion was seconded by Councilman Hugh A. Wright, and a “yea” and “nay” vote was taken, with the following results:

Those voting “yea” or in favor of the adoption of the ordinance: Hugh A. Wright, D.W. Stowell, Fred Shirley, James S. Webster, and Frank D. Kelley.

Those voting “nay” or against the adoption of the ordinance: none.

A majority of the whole number of Councilmen elected to the Council having voted in favor of the adoption of the ordinance, the Mayor declared it duly adopted, and approved the same, and ordered it spread at length on the minutes.

The Mayor thereupon signed the ordinance and the City Clerk countersigned it, affixed the corporate seal thereto and attested it. The City Clerk was instructed to cause a full and true copy of the ordinance as passed to be published within one month after its passage in Rexburg Standard, a newspaper published and in general circulation in the City of Rexburg, Idaho.
