Resolution 12-17-1958

EXTRACT OF THE MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REXBURG, HELD DECEMBER 17, 1958 AT 7:30 P.M. IN THE CITY HALL, REXBURG, IDAHO.

Alma Klingler presented the following resolution to the City Council and moved its adoption. Seconded by M.D. Morrell. On roll call the following members of the City Council voted "Aye": Tom Webster, M.D. Morrell, A.L. Klingler, G. Alton Anderson, R.W. Purrington. There were no "nay" votes.

WHEREAS, C.F. Forsgren has made a materials costs estimate for proposed oiled roads in the modified Powell addition to the City of Rexburg, Idaho, and

WHEREAS, said estimate shows the proposed oiling of the road in front of the following lots:

Lots 11,12, 13, and 14 in Block 3.

Lots 16, 17, and 18 in Block 7.

Lots 2 and 3 in Block 6, and

WHEREAS, the sidewalks curbing and driveways are in place in front of the residences located on the above described lots, and

WHEREAS, said engineer's estimate shows the material costs for such proposed oiling to be in the amount of \$1,110.10, and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary to use equipment in laying said oiled roads and the City of Rexburg has certain equipment available to assist with such work, and

WHEREAS, the said E.L. Powell has deposited with the City of Rexburg, a cashier's check in the amount of \$1,110.00, for the payment of said material costs according to the engineers estimate;

NOW, THEREFOER, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE City of Rexburg assist the said E.L. Powell with the oiling of said roads in front of the above described lots by making available for the use of said E.L. Powell in the oiling of said roads the available city road equipment. It being understood that such work must be completed September 1, 1959.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said \$1,110.00 be released for the payment of said material costs when necessary:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Rexburg hereby approves and accepts the sidewalks, curbs and gutters as the same are now installed in the Powell addition to the City of Rexburg, in front of the above described lots.
