How it all started. . .

- Growing need and interest in curbside recycling for no additional cost.
- Continued need for student employment.
- City had no where to go with recycling.
- BYU-I was not using its facility to its potential.
 - only operating a few hours a day.
- Meeting held and council approved a curbside recycling test study on two sub-divisions.

Trial Phase

- **Cresthaven and Hidden Valley neighborhoods were selected as trial neighborhoods for data collection and citizen participation.**
- **3 Phases for curbside recycling have been identified**
 - **Phase 1, collect and weigh garbage for two months to get base line data**
 - **Phase 2, ask citizens to separate recycled goods and garbage. Both waste streams will be weighed, recycled goods will be sorted & weighed by commodity**
 - **Phase 3, if trial can show operations can break even, curbside recycling will begin in June 2012.**


Expanding – Phase 3

The Lifecycle of Recycled Goods

When you recycle you are diverting plastics, papers, metals, and other re-usable items away from landfills and giving them an extended life. Thank you for recycling.

Businesses and Households

Once a commodity makes it to landfill it won't be recovered or re-used.

Recycled goods are brought here to be sorted, compressed, and shipped off.

Materials Recovery Facility

On average, it takes less energy to produce items from recycled materials. For example, making aluminum cans from recycled aluminum saves **95%** of the energy used to produce aluminum from bauxite ore.

Recycling helps with **SOURCE REDUCTION**, which is reducing the amount of natural resources we use to produce new products. Recycling is good news for the environment.
